Sketchbook Floral is a reversible solutiondyed acrylic weave from Chella Textiles' Contours Collection. Shown in Green Oasis, it is available in five additional colorways.



Sunbrella has been manufacturing outdoor fabrics since 1961; Earthen Collection is one of its recent introductions. It includes stripes, solids, a velvet and a nubby boucle.



Designer Liora Manné used a patented process to create a line of indoor/outdoor textiles from polyester fibers coated with natural latex. Her Vines pattern is shown in Sage on these outdoor ottomans.



Vividly colored flowers are the centerpiece of Liora Manné's Disco fabric. It comes in five colorways, including white (pictured), and has an antimicrobial finish to prevent deterioration and mildew.



The Sand Collection by Sunbrella features a neutral palette warmed by orange and red hues. The company's textiles are stain- and fade-resistant, and are made from recyclable material.



Suitable for furniture on covered patios, Paul Brayton Designs' Almost Collection replicates leather. The fabric is offered in 32 colorways, as well as an embossed suede. \square See Sources.
