Chella introduces Coco, a group of boucle/chenille tweeds designed for outdoors and indoors that truly look like they came off the runways of Paris. According to designer Scott Bodenner, Chella is the first to create an outdoor fabric with chenille and boucle in both warp and weft of the weave.
